I don't think our success will have a great deal to do with that, our recruiting pools aren't as alike as you think, they're always going to offer the sam best players in Utah, why wouldn't they? But outside of Utah, we don't compete with Utah, we compete with the Pac 10. If we went independent, you could take Utah off our schedule; it would hurt Utah 100 times worse than it would hurt BYU.
