The greatest benefit in trading that #1 pick is that the Dolphins will suddenly find themselves with a lot of cap space to use in free agency, which happens to be where Parcels likes to find his quarterbacks.

It would take a lot more than the #18 and #50 pick to get the #1. The GM's usually stick pretty close to the draft value chart when trading draft picks. The #1 pick is worth 3000 points, which means they would expect to get 3000 points worth of picks in return. The #18 is worth 900 and the #50 is worth 400, so that wouldn't even be worth half the value. It would take much more to get a trade done.

I think Dallas has a much better shot but even with multiple first round picks they will have to throw in more to make the offer even appealing. The Barber III rumors along with their two #1's might be about right. Dallas' #22 is worth 780 and #28 is worth 660. That puts them about even with the Minnesota situation as far as picks go and I don't know a ton about barber III (I hate the cowboys) so I don't know if that will be enough either.

I don't think this draft class is as good as many in the past so they might not be able to get full value but it would probably be in their best interest to try to stockpile picks and talent.

It would take a lot more than the #18 and #50 pick to get the #1. The GM's usually stick pretty close to the draft value chart when trading draft picks. The #1 pick is worth 3000 points, which means they would expect to get 3000 points worth of picks in return. The #18 is worth 900 and the #50 is worth 400, so that wouldn't even be worth half the value. It would take much more to get a trade done.

I think Dallas has a much better shot but even with multiple first round picks they will have to throw in more to make the offer even appealing.
