Regarding #2, I think Collie's injury was a fluke in the Tulsa game - his ankle got twisted on an usual tackle and he played hobbled for most of the year.

It's been a LONG time (too long) to see something exciting on kickoff returns. Too often, the ball ends on the goal line and we just simply return it to around the 20 or 25, anyways.

I think Bronco will seriously look at the kickoff (and, in general, Special Teams) as a way to change/gain field position. Some of those run-backs changed the perspective of the game. Rather than starting on 25, we start on the 35 or 40 (or BETTER), we gain anywhere from 1-4 extra "plays" that we don't have to execute.

Adding in to that, we all expect kickoffs to get better when Sorensen's foot will be behind the ball. Forcing teams to start at NO BETTER than their own 20 means that THEY will have to execute that many more plays for a score - more opportunities for them to make a mistake.

I believe that's one of the reasons we lost the regular-season game with UCLA last year (besides the fumbles, the penalties, and the officiating....) - it was a difference in field position. They started better than there 35 and we started no better than our own 20.

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
