Yeah, I'm not too sure I saw the loss tonight as the beginning of the end. Despite playing on the road with one day's rest after a physical series against a team coming off 5 days' rest after a laugher of a series, the Jazz still had the advantage in the second half, and were still very much so in the game with 100 seconds left.

Then look at the stat sheet, and despite shooting 8% worse from the field, 29% worse from 3, 9% worse from the stripe and attempting 16 fewer FTs, the Jazz still were in the game, and only lost by 11.

The Jazz had a terrible, turnover/mistake ridden first half, and then they came out, tidied things up and played a solid second half. I expect the series to go the way of the second half, and I expect either a Jazz win in 6, or the Lakers in 7. I don't think LA wins in Salt Lake, but I do think the Jazz have a shot on Wednesday at taking one at Staples, especially if LA gives up 25 offensive rebounds again.

The Jazz finished in the bottom have of the league in field goal percentage allowed (17th of 30), worse than all 7 remaining Playoff teams. They also have the worst 3-point defense of the remaining 8. And they were 22nd in the NBA for creating turnovers, and 22nd for blocked shots.

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1) Just because the Jazz finished in the middle of the league in points allowed and FG% allowed, doesn't mean they aren't good. Remember, they were also one of the BEST teams in point DIFFERENTIAL. Keep in mind that the Jazz are also the 5th YOUNGEST team in the league. That means they have a huge upside. I didn't say they were the

greatest defensive team - but they are decent to be one of the top 8 teams in the league right now.

1a) 3-point FG defense has historically been a problem for the Jazz. Their philosophy is if you are going to make a 3, fine. They would rather defend the paint than give up a lower percentage shot. More times than not, a team that lives by the 3 will DIE by the 3.

1b) While not being great at creating turnovers, the Jazz more than make up for this in Assist/Turnover Ratio: 2nd in the league. As for Blocks/Game, you are WAY off on this. The Jazz are 4th in the league @ 8.7/game.
