Dick appears to think that these two statements are contradictory. If Trent needs an agent to get to the camp, that means his draft stock isn't that high and he will likely go undrafted because the NBA isn't stupid - they know who is out there and what teams are looking at.

So, if you are on the draft radar you will get an invite with or without an agent; if you aren't on the radar you may get in with an agent but you are unlikely to get drafted. If Trent hired an agent to get to the camp, he is likely looking at Europe right now.

There are very few players ready to be successful in the NBA from day 1. The NBA knows that. That's why most draft picks spend a large amount of time on the bench or in the D-league before they are ready to contribute in a couple of years.

Look at the Lakers. Bynum's potential was undeniable. It took 2 full seasons before he really became a player in the league. Jordan Farmar bounced back and forth from the D-league to the NBA THIS SEASON. And now, he's a contributor.
