BYU received pledge from All-American QB

The quarterback era after Max Hall just got more dramatic on Memorial Day when one of the most prolific quarterbacks in high school history announced he would sign with BYU.

Riley Nelson, a Parade All-America QB from Logan, who attended Utah State as a freshman before going on an LDS mission, will play at BYU upon his return from Barcelona, Spain in March 2009, according to his father, Keith Nelson.

With permission from his mission president, Nelson and BYU coaches have communicated through e-mail and came to an understanding about Nelson transferring to BYU. Nelson informed his parents of the decision on Monday morning, a national holiday.

"He looked at this from an emotional, academic and athletic perspective and decided this was the best thing for him to do," according to Keith Nelson.

At 6 foot-1, Nelson was one of the bright spots for the Aggies when he took over QB duties during a dismal season two years ago.

Nelson's football resume is as good as they come - regardless of competition.

"Riley believes he has a lot to learn from BYU quarterback coach Brandon Doman. He respects him and is looking forward to working with him. Riley wanted to get this decision out of the way so he could focus on the most important thing in his life right now, his mission work, which he loves," said Keith.

Here is a breakout of his profile on Utah State's website:

He was named a Parade All-American... Named Mr. Football in the state of Utah by the Deseret Morning News... Was the Gatorade Utah Football Player of the Year as well... Was an all-state selection and the class 3A MVP... Set a national record accounting for 84 touchdowns (53 passing and 31 rushing) as a senior... Also set national record for six touchdowns per game... Finished his high school career with nine Utah state records, including career total touchdowns (130), career passing touchdowns (79), season completions (277), season passing yards (4,041), season passing touchdowns (53), season total touchdowns (84), season total yards (5,815), single-game completions (38) and single-game touchdown passes (seven)... Led Logan to the 3A state championship as a senior... Also played baseball for three years and was a two-time all-region selection... Played basketball one season... Born June 2, 1988 in Salt Lake City, Utah... Son of Keith and Joni Nelson... Father played football at USU, while his grandfather Rod Tueller was an Aggie basketball coach and athletics director...

Usually I am a bit hesitant to accept players into the program who were initially recruited by BYU, spurned BYU to go elsewhere, and then have a change of heart on the mission. (Note that this does not include players who were not offered by BYU before their missions) However, I can completely understand Riley's perspective on this one. When he signed with USU, they had a new coach, a new offensive coordinator, the conference was on an upswing, and there was a lot of buzz about the future and the ends the school was willing to go to in order to make things happen. Fast forward two years, and you have one of the worst programs in the nation, the new coach and OC are on the piping-hot-seat, the conference is headed south, the administration is not investing in the program, and the school is on the cusp of being sent down to the minors by the NCAA.

I can absolutely understand that things have fundamentally changed that influenced his decision, and those things combined with the resurgence of BYU, not only as a program but a nationally reknowned passing program, made this an easy decision.

Were he a player who spurned us for a BCS school, didn't get any playing time there, and then decided to transfer back after his mission--that I would have a hard time accepting. This one, not so much.

You might have some haters, but you also have to remember that he also gave Logan a state football title. He's a hero in that town and I still think there will be more love than hate for him there.

While I get that this is a loss for USU, he's not considered the #1 recruit in the nation, like Ben O. was when he announced he was leaving. It hurt a great deal because of what we perceived to have lost. Just from looking at Rileys freshman #s, it's not likely that they expected the kid to win a ton of games on his own. His numbers suggest a mature kid that could handle the job early, but not a world beater (like Detmers freshman games)

If you're going to make a decision like he did; I'd say better to do it now rather than risk BYU recruiting too many others to the position; with Jacob Bower, Doman, and Cooper leaving, I'll bet the idea had bounced around Rileys head for quite a while now. The mere fact that Brandon Doman was a small athletic quarterback that earned a chance to not only start at BYU but play a little pro ball was probably all the convincing Nielson needed, considering he knows exactly when Hall will be graduating.

If Jake Heaps has mission plans, Nielson would fit nicely between Hall and Heaps; if Nielson can win the job from Lark and Munns.

Again, I think the only exciting thing about this is that we'll have some depth and competition for the position in the future. I don't think we can assume that Riley will be a star by any means. He does seem like a smart athletic kid that understands how to play QB; how that translates to playing QB in a top 10-15 perrenial program is still to be seen.

My reading of the articles confirms your timeline.

You bring up an interesting point about whether BYU directly contacted Riley Nelson or his family made the pitch. Is there really a significant difference between the parents contacting a missionary or BYU directly contacting a missionary? In my mind there is a difference between a family member letting a recruit know that they can transfer to another school and have a scholarship if they want it, and the school actively writing the student athlete directly. The family acts as a buffer and thus, filters the communication in such a way that a person may not feel as much pressure as they might if in direct communication with the school.

What does the timeline say about the events?

First, I would add that after Riley's parents learned of BYU's interest, they (not BYU) contacted the mission president to see if they could pass the information on to Riley.

Then, the articles contradict each other.

In one, Rileys father says he passed on the info that Riley needed to make the decision. "We gave Riley what information he felt like he needed and he contacted us a week or two afterward..." .

The other article paraphrases the father and says as follows:

However, Keith Nelson said that "casual conversations" between BYU receivers coach Patrick Higgins and Logan High coach Mike Favero eventually led to a discussions via e-mail between Riley Nelson and BYU coaches, "and the rest is history."

Keith Nelson said when news reached him that BYU had some interest, he requested permission from his son's mission president to address the issue.

The second article seems to blur the events and mentions getting the mission president's permission as an after thought. My guess is that the writer wasn't really sure who made the contact with Riley, and "filled in the blanks." The direct quote, where Riley's father said he provided the information, seems more credible as it is a direct quote, and consistent with other stories, such as Brandon Bradley's, where the family lets the athlete know they can go to BYU if they want.

Regardless of what's been said, after a year on a mission, any athlete on a mission, in military service, etc. etc. etc. is free game. It's not against the rules to contact them. So you bet that other schools are contacting our athletes. Like the local radio guys here say about sports, "If you're not cheating, you're not trying." and in this case it's not even against the rules. So rest assured that other schools make a common practice of it; especially for athletes that they had previously recruited.

So while fans may complain, #1 schools contact missionaries (yes, even BYU) #2 it's not against the rules, no school owns a kid and if a school believes that they offer a better future, etc. for that kid; they should be allowed to contact them. A lot of things change at age 18-19-21, especially after serving the lord for 2 years.

The question about whether or not the church should step in is pretty absurd though. The sheer number of missionaries versus the number that would be actively recruited to play high level sports is next to null. You're talking about a likely maximum of 50 athletes and as low as 10-15 (this is all D1 football and basketball athletes from all D1 schools going on missions that might be recruited by other schools) a year/55,000+ new missionaries per year. We're talking about .0003 - .001 or less than 1/100th of a percent and even then how would that be any different than allowing missionaries to work on college entrance papers, etc. in the mission field?
